










PROJECT CONTEXT | NYC PARKS SHORELINE PARKS PLAN



The project area encompasses 3 designated swimming beaches, 24 acres of athletic fields, seven playgrounds, an 800 foot fishing pier, and over 1,000 acres of NYC Parks' property from the edge of Fort Wadsworth to the edge of Great Kills.











PROJECT CONTEXT | USACE'S LINE OF PROTECTION (LOP)





NYC Parks is undertaking a <u>Shoreline Parks Plan</u> for the East Shore of Staten Island, to envision how city parks and recreational amenities can adapt to the incoming USACE Line of Protection. The plan is dependent on the USACE Line of Protection being implemented first. NYC Parks seeks to create a Shoreline Parks Plan that re-envisions parks and open space to align with the USACE LOP design and integrate community priorities. **All items in the Shoreline Parks Plan are subject to further Army Corps project design and revisions.**








PROJECT CONTEXT | SHORELINE BIKE PATH

Bike Network Connected to Waterfront



Meeting Overview


The design team introduced the project and presented the concept designs for each neighborhood connection.

Attendees had active discussions on what they would like to see in breakout groups and participated in polls throughout the meeting.



- Shade planting and green infrastructure will be integrated along the bike path








Theme: Civic Gathering

Seaview is the civic hub of the Shoreline with spaces for community gathering and celebration. The neighborhood connection's performance lawn will be expanded, the existing memorial will be integrated with the flood protection barrier, and Freedom Plaza will be renovated to make it more pedestrian friendly.







South Beach provides access to the Shoreline's northernmost beaches and the greenway transitions to Fort Wadsworth. South Beach is a center for food along the Shoreline, a new concessions building is complemented by space for food trucks and picnicking in the arrival plaza.
