He said that the effort to adjust and equalize the pay of the Foremen of Laborers, which he favored as being fair and just, would have to be made in a supplemental application to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment by each Commissioner in his individual administrative jurisdiction.

Mr. McQuade of the Committee suggested as a view held by the members of the Association that an utterance in favor of the increase of pay on the part

of the Park Board would be helpful in securing it.

Commissioner O'Rourke explained that the foremen in the Borough of Richmond were per diem employees and expressed his entire sympathy with the

effort to do justice to the men concerned.

Commissioner Butler said that the situation in the Borough of Queens was identical with that in Richmond, and that he was fully in favor of action by the Board and by the individual commissioners to correct the condition complained of.

Gentlemen:

We have received a considerable number of complaints relative to the presence of rag-weed in the parks of this City and the danger of hay fever infection due to the discharge of pollen from these weeds.

A cursory survey of our parks show these complaints to be justified. The pollen from these weeds causes suffering among a section of our people, which suffering is preventable.

While it is somewhat late this year to remove all such rag-weed from the public parks, may I ask that your Board, through its individual membership, require all of your park employees to root out or cut down rag-weed where it is found in the parks under their supervision?
